

BUKIT MINYAK UTAMA PHASE 5



This is the last phase that we were involved in for the client at Bukit Minyak Utama. The site is an elongated site where we planned and obtained the maximum number of units possible-4 units of 2 storey semi detached homes and 90 units of 2 storey terrace houses together with a community hall.

The terraced units are designed with a high soffit height and as subsequently an impressive external facade resembling an additional storey is created. In order to create more value, additional open space is created in the middle of the blocks; thus more corner units are created.

BERTAM PERDANA 2 PHASE 2D-1



The components for this phase are 16 units of single storey bungalows and 26 units of double storey semi detached houses. There are 2 different types of bungalows for the project.

The units are accorded with a spacious rooms, coupled with high ceiling and the lush landscape that surrounds them in a 'nusantara' theme.

BERTAM PERDANA 2 PHASE 2D-2



For this phase, the main component is the double storey terrace units where there were 111 units.

The rest of the components include 7 units of double storey bungalows, 11 units of single storey bungalows and 10 units of double storey semi detached houses.

As this space was located in the same precinct as Bertam Perdana 2-Phase 2D-1, there was a need to use certain similar elements in terms of roof colors, architectural language as well as external cladding stone in order for uniformity.

BERTAM PERDANA 2 PHASE 2C



As this phase was large, we had to create multiple designs for the different components of the project. There were 15 units of single storey bungalows, 18 units of double storey bungalows, 38 units of single storey semi detached houses, 6 units of double storey semi detached houses and 33 units of 2 storey terraced homes.

The units were planned with a central open space that faces the entrance to this precinct. In order to have a uniformed feel for the phases, the colors, material and form are repeated for the different components of the project.

BERTAM PERDANA 2 PHASE 3-1A



There are only 50 units of houses planned for this phase. They consist of 16 units of single storey bungalows and 34 units of single storey semi detached houses. The bungalows are located on the periphery of the development while a row of the semi detached houses face the open space.

As with the other projects that we have completed for the client, the roof color, material and architecture finishes have been chosen to blend in with other homes designed for this precinct.















BERTAM PERDANA 4 PHASE 3C-1



Tucked away behind the Industrial Training Institute, Kepala Batas is this phase which consists of 112 units of 2 storey terraced houses. There are 8 blocks which were previously planned for this phase.

Again, the colors of the roof, typology and architecture finishing for the terraced houses have been planned for modern living.

WESTLITE BUKIT TAMBUN



This was the first Centralized Labour Quarters that we have designed in Penang. Although Westlite has many years of experience operating worker dormitories in Johor and Singapore, this was their first foray to Penang.

As this was the first purpose built CLQ in Penang, we had to work with both the state government and the local authorities. Subsequently guidelines were produced which all future submissions had to comply with.

The complex complies with the requirements of Act 446, the Ministry of Human Resource as well as the standards advocated by the Responsible Business Alliance.

There were 25 double storey shop offices and 40 three storey offices that we were asked to design for this project. The units are all next to the main road for this existing development at Machang Bubok.




